- 3.1. At its meeting on 11th April 2017, the Council resolved to adopt in principle the Strategic Plan. It was agreed to split out the committee specific items for further detail to be applied and in particular to identify the priority and time scale of those projects. The projects to be considered are shown at **Appendix A**;
- 3.2. The detail and timescales of the projects will inform the budget setting process for the coming five years and identify the staffing requirements for the same period.
- 3.3. Time for public consultation should be factored in to the project timescale.
- 3.4. In considering the timescale of the projects to be undertaken, the Committee should consider pre-existing commitments of the Council and its statutory duties which are to be carried out alongside the projects.

Officer Report

1. Purpose of Report

3. Updates

- 3.1. Grass Cutting the new mower is showing great benefit in the quality of grass cutting in the town and the time saved on this area of work.
- 3.2. Play areas there is remedial worked scheduled to be carried out at Wincombe Recreation Ground, the Committee should consider beginning to replace the equipment at this location as it is approaching the end of its life. St James Park is regarded as one of the prettiest of Shaftesbury's parks and the wooden play trail is still in a sound condition with only routine repairs being required.
- 3.3. Park Walk it is anticipated that the repair of the shelter on Park Walk will be completed this summer.
- 3.4. Scheduled Ancient Monuments Shaftesbury Open Spaces group and Historic England are working together on management plans for these sensitive areas and these will be put before the Committee for consideration in due course.
- 3.5. Castle Hill Green the Town Clerk is investigating the feasibility of registering Castle Hill Green as a Town Green, a report will be provided in due course.
- 3.6. Salisbury Street Green the Town Clerk is investigating the possibility of acquiring the grass area at Salisbury Street, a report will be provided in due course.
- 3.7. Mampitts Lane Community Land the launch of the 4 month call for ideas was held at Mampitts Lane on 8th April 2017. Some interesting ideas have already come forward, the Council will continue to invite comments until August 2017.
