#### **Public Participation**

Members of the public were invited to make representations to the Council on any matters relating to the work of the Council or to raise any issues of concern. The following matters were raised;

- Enmore Court Strong objections were expressed regarding the planning appeal on the Land north of Enmore Court and off New Road Shaftesbury. Concerns raised about preservation of slopes and landscape, blind bends and very dangerous access for pedestrians and cyclist. Concerns raised about the suitability of the land for development which is on green sand.
- 32 High Street Shaftesbury Civic Society welcomed the refurbishment and urged the Council to encourage retaining as retail A1 or A3 use.
- Road Safety concerns regarding level of speeding and dangerous driving in Shaftesbury High street and Bell Street.

- P35a Report 0919PH6 was received and it was **RESOLVED** to submit a letter to the Planning Inspectorate reinforcing the objections submitted to the Planning Authority and drawing attention to additional relevant information due to changed circumstances since the original application was submitted. These to include;
  - · Contrary to the emerging neighbourhood plan policies;
    - SFGI2 seeks to ensure development respects Shaftesbury's topography and its position in the landscape, recognizing that the steep slopes, hilltop and the lower settlements of St James and Enmore Green are all highly sensitive to development, and the extent to which tree cover is important to the incorporation of new development on the shallower slopes.
    - SFCL3 seeks to support safe walking and cycling routes that are well connected with the Town Centre and other key areas and that provide access to the countryside, and encourage improvements to this network, including where opportunities arise within developments to create new links or make existing routes more attractive.
  - The Geology of the land is unsuitable for development as it consists of Green sand.
  - Support the content of the Shaftesbury Civic Society letter to the inspectorate on this application
  - Contrary to the 2003 Slopes policies in the North Dorset Local Plan:

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- Policy SB3 Development which would reduce or urbanise the distinct rural character of the Slopes will not be permitted. Development will only be allowed if it can be shown that the proposal is in keeping with the character of the area and will not adversely affect views from higher and lower ground.
- Policy SB4 New development will only be permitted where the design and location of the proposal strengthens local character.
   Development which masks the dramatic effect of the topography or adversely affects views from higher or lower ground will not be permitted.
- Outside of the settlement boundary.
- Appellant had not engaged with the Town Council

#### Good Evening

I am and I am a Shaftesbury Resident of Indus Road, Chilmark Glade, in the Eastern Development of Shaftesbury.

This relates to the General poor Access to the Eastern Development in Shaftesbury and to the proposed MAMPITTS LANE BUS GATE.

My wife and I moved to Shaftesbury from Plymouth 18 months ago in order to be closer to our children, having been visiting relatives here for the last 30 years. We chose Shaftesbury due to its location, history and reputation as a friendly, inclusive, vibrant and close knit community.

Thanks to the local press, I have recently become aware of the plan by Dorset Council to permanently shut off the Mampitts Lane access to and from the estate for all vehicles, except non-existent buses, with a barricade obstacle ridiculously called a 'bus gate'. This is one of only two ways in to this very large and new part of Shaftesbury, and the one which is the most practical, most direct and most environmentally friendly.

I was saddened to read the report of this Council's Planning and Highways meeting of the 13th August which was evidently well attended by residents of the Pound Lane area, but with apparently no one in attendance from the vastly greater population of the Eastern development.

These few Pound Lane residents described Pound Lane as being a 'rat run'. This is a gross insult to the other residents of Shaftesbury and is a totally biased misconstrusion of reality. We residents of the Eastern development are not rats. We are equal in status to all Shaftesbury residents, no matter how long you have lived here.

This sensible and logical route along Pound Lane and Mampitts Lane to access the rest of Shaftesbury and all points North and West is fully used by the residents of Pound Lane and surrounding areas as much as anyone else.

Nowhere else in Shaftesbury is a whole section of seven hundred homes and over two thousand citizens being cut off and totally inconvenienced for ever more!

Even when the plan was to link up the new estates with Wincombe Lane, it made no sense to cut off the Mampitts Lane route. Now that this other link is definitely not going to happen, the insane plan to install this misnomered 'bus gate', must be halted! It is a car barricade! There is no bus service at all and even if there was, people need the vehicular access that they currently have and need.

The situation has totally changed, and so must this awful plan to cut off the Eastern Development.

It is totally wrong to reduce the whole Eastern Development to having only one entry and access point which is actually on the wrong side of town for all sensible and efficient movement to and from all of Shaftesbury's facilities and its centre.

This council must start fighting for the citizens of the East instead of allowing them to be barricaded off permanently.

Pound Lane is a wide road that is totally suitable for all the traffic it deals with. The fact that Pound Lane residents use this road as their car and work van car park, instead of their garages and driveways, is another issue of their making.

Purchasers of properties on the news estates were not made aware they would be shut off. If anyone was actually told of the original plan, it was for two access points to the East and my solicitor's searches revealed only vague plans referring to 'initial access'.

The closure of the Mampitts Lane access to all citizens vehicular traffic will severely affect the quality of life to the 700 odd households on the estate – as the only remaining vehicular access being at the extreme far

end of the estate will result in much longer journeys and necessitates a traffic light controlled right turn towards Shaftesbury – the likely direction for the vast majority of users.

For one example, anyone living near the Mampitts Lane Spar shop driving to the Tesco roundabout and via Pound Lane drives 482 metres, but once cut off, having to go the via Allen Road it is 1,600 metres so the additional round trip journey would be 2.2 kilometres — clearly if we are rats then we are rats with a sense of consideration for carbon emissions and this does not factor in the interminable wait at the two sets of traffic lights and delays at the Royal Chase roundabout at peak times.

Why should Pound Lane be treated differently from any other urban thoroughfare in Shaftesbury? No other roads in Shaftesbury are blocked off to the detriment of huge numbers of citizens.

Clearly Shaftesbury is at risk of becoming a divided town with newer residents on the Eastern estate, the majority being younger, working age families being ostracised by a minority of longer term residents.

Eastern Development residents will have their quality of life seriously eroded forever, due to the complaints of this minority who do not wish to adapt to the evolution of this town, if Mampitts Lane is blocked off with this car obstacle or barricade.

This current unimaginative plan to inconvenience the Eastern Development residents forever needs to be addressed and stopped urgently by you, our elected representatives. You must take ownership of this issue and realise that this is a nonsensical and out of date plan.

I would like to propose a public meeting to be held here in the town hall on an evening that working families would be able to attend with Unitary council highways and planning representatives in attendance.

I would also suggest the following:

- 1. A concerted, unified effort by councillors and our MP lobbying for the early construction of the outer relief road / by pass, giving access to and from the estate in the area of the Salisbury Road to the East, as well as to the North of Shaftesbury.
- 2. Urgent consideration given to installing traffic calming measures along Pound Lane, Mampitts Lane and Allen Road with a speed reduction to 20 mph and the introduction of parking restrictions on both roads during day time.
- 3. The Unitary and Town Council must also act urgently improve the terrible access from Mampitts Road to Pound Lane and Mampitts Lane adjacent to the cemetery. This is in urgent need of improvement as there is no foot path and only very narrow vehicular access. This out of date restriction can of course be easily rectified by modifications to the location of the cemetery railings boundary and movement of the hedge opposite and the addition of a pavement as well as slight road narrowing there. The town council can easily enable this as both the cemetery and the allotments are town council land.

I therefore call upon all of this council, in Particular the Mayor and Deputy Mayor as Unitary Councillors, and Councillor Yeo as the only East Ward councillor who actually lives in the Eastern Development, to stop the thousands of Shastonian residents in the East being cut off and totally inconvenience forevermore with this appalling 'car barricade' bus gate.

What will this council do to stop this appalling plan to cut us off in the Eastern Development and to instead improve the access to, and the road safety in the East?
