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1.1 Background

Proposed Resolution	To resolve to amend for 12 months sec.2.4.5 of the Scheme of Delegation to authorise the Town Clerk to make single or various payments up to a total of £20,000 without authorisation.	
Background (provided by the proposer)	R68a The Town Clerk is the Responsible Financial Officer for the purposes of Section 151 of the Local Government Act 1972; and is designated and authorised to act as Proper Officer for the purposes of all relevant sections of the LGA 1972.	
	R68b The Scheme of Delegation authorises the Proper Officer and Responsible Financial Officer to act with delegated authority in specific circumstances. Those include:	
	 R68c a) Sec. 2.4.5 which allows the Clerk to approve emergency expenditure up to £5000 outside of an agreed budget. The Clerk may seek emergency authorisation from the General Management Committee for further expenditure up to an additional £10,000; and 	
	 R68d b) Sec. 4.1.1 Subject to consultation (ibid.) the Town Clerk is authorised to act on behalf of the Council on any matter where urgent action is needed to protect the interests of the Town Council. 	
	R68e The Coronavirus epidemic has demonstrated that the current delegated powers do not give the Clerk the clearest mandate to make expenditure decisions in rapid response to the crisis. To resolve this it is proposed to amend sec. 2.4.5 of the Scheme of Delegation for 12 months to allow the Clerk to approve emergency expenditure up to £20,000 in total	

	as either one or several payments without requiring further authorisation. Sec 4.1.2 requires that, before the Clerk exercises the delegated powers, members consulted should consider whether the matter justifies summoning an Extra-ordinary Meeting of the Council. It does, and a meeting has been requested to consider the Motion.
Financial implication (anticipated by the proposer)	Authorised expenditure in one or in several commitments up to a total limit of £20,000
	This will temporarily override s.1.14 and section 4.1 of the Financial Regulations which require the Council to approve any grant or a single commitment in excess of $\pounds 5,000$.
Legal implications (considered by the proposer)	There are no legal impediments to the delegation of these financial powers or the execution thereof:
	1. The Local Government Act 1972, s111, empowers a local council to do anything (whether or not involving the expenditure, borrowing or lending of money or the acquisition or disposal of property or rights) which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of its functions
	2. The LGA 1972, s137 empowers a local council to spend up to a prescribed amount in any one year for the direct benefit of their area or any part of it or all or some of its inhabitants
	3. The Localism Act 2011 empowers an 'eligible' parish council (which would include Shaftesbury Town Council) to use the general power of competence conferred on principal authorities by section 1 of the Act.
