## To consider a response to the Local Transport Plan 2026-2041

## **Information**

## To consider three Highways requests

#### Information

These three requests are supported by Dorset Councillor Jack Jeanes and signatures have been obtained for each request, as per the Community Highways policy.

#### 7.1 New Road (The cut through from the B3081 to the A30)

This is currently a national speed limit road with no pavements for residents that live on the road. Residents would like to reduce this to a 30mph road to create a safer environment. Furthermore, it is not suitable for HGVs to be using this route, so another additional ask would be to request that DC evaluate the road, and if appropriate erect signage stating that the road is 'unsuitable for HGVs'.

#### 7.2 Wincombe Lane

Support from residents has been obtained to request that Wincombe Lane is reduced from 30mph to 20mph. This is something Cllr Jeanes has discussed with the Primary School in the past too, therefore it is known that they also support this change.

Along with the S278 works completed by David Wilson to improve Wincombe Lane, residents and Cllr Jeanes feel that reducing the speed limit would increase the safety for both residents and school children walking to school and home from school. If a person is hit by a car at 30mph the likelihood they will be killed is 50%, this is reduced to 10% at 20Mph, so near a school it is definitely worth considering this change.

### 7.3 Sweetman's Road

Sweetman's Road is a wide, long, fairly straight road. For many years this road has been used as a local racetrack and the residents of Sweetman's Road, along with other roads off Sweetman's Road have become frustrated with the speed.

Due to the nature of this road, it is believed that reducing the speed limit wouldn't work. Therefore, other preventative measures like the installation of a SID near the junction of Springfield Close could be considered. This is also where another entrance to the Primary School is located.

Note: In August 2024, the Dorset Council SID team advised that: We have some data from 2018 on this road, close to the junction with Springfield Close. 85th percentile was 29.8mph, so below the threshold for a SID and average speed 24.3mph, so generally good compliance with the speed limit. We would not expect any significant change if the survey was repeated.

The survey was carried out at the junction of Sweetman's Road and Springfield Close.

The DC SID team clarified that the previous results were a long way off to meeting the criteria. It needs to be an 85%ile of 35mph to meet criteria, the 85%ile here was only 29.8mph. It is highly unlikely it has increased that much since the last survey unless the road layout has significantly changed.

The cost of the survey is £295+VAT and the equipment is in place for up to two weeks, showing weekday and weekend data.

#### Recommendation

Members are requested to consider

- (1) if they wish to request for Dorset Council to reduce the speed limit along New Road to 30mph and to erect signage stating that the road is 'unsuitable for HGVs'.
- (2) to include a 20mph request for Wincombe Lane in the town wide residential areas 20mph consideration
- (3) if they wish to instruct Dorset Council to undertake a survey at a cost of £295 + VAT to understand if a SID would be useful at the location of Sweetman's Road/ Springfield Close.
