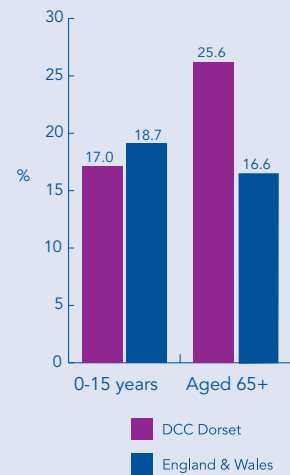

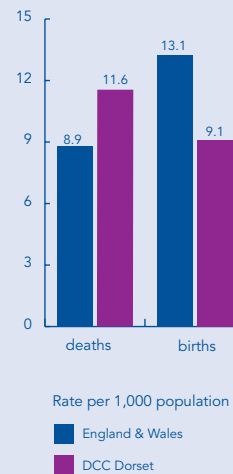

## Proportion of Young and Old People (Mid Year Estimate 2010)



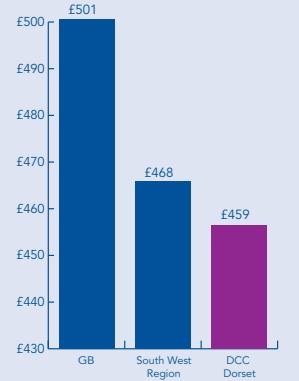

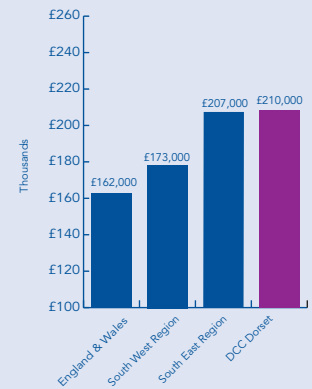

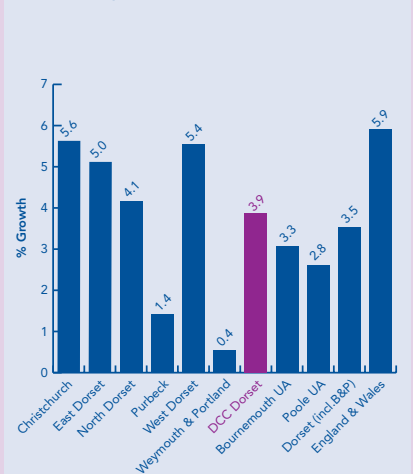

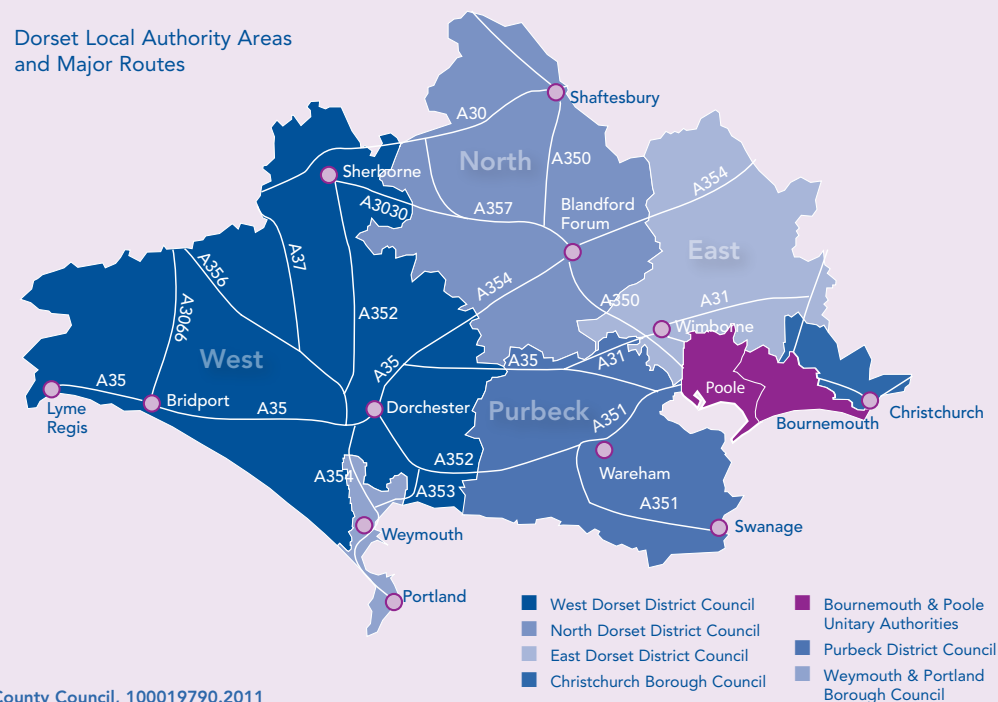

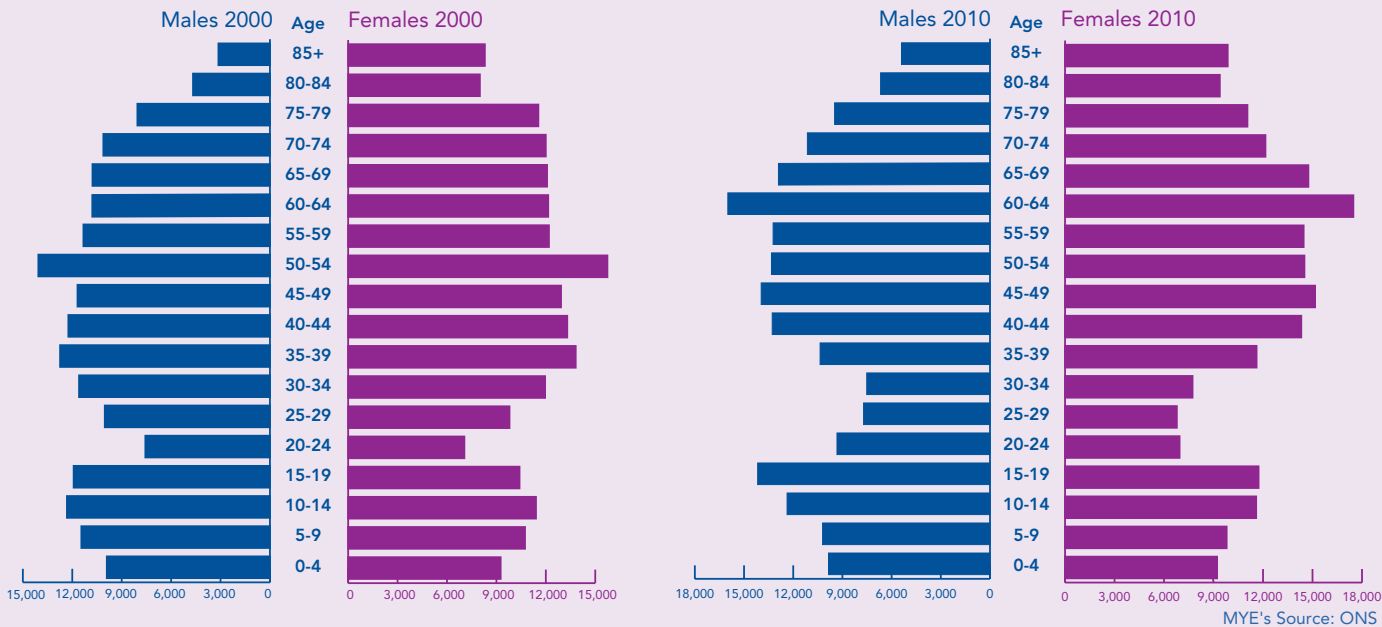

Age Structure

What the table and chart show

- The population pyramids (above) show the number of people by 5 year age bands in 2000 and 2010 (as detailed in the table).
- During the last 10 years, the population in DCC Dorset has increased by 15,105 people, a rise of 3.88%.
- In 2000 many of the 5 year age bands had similar numbers except for the 20-24 age group which had lower numbers. This changes significantly by 2010. By 2010 there have been significant rises in the number of those aged over 60 with that age group increasing by nearly 24,000 people and now making up 34% of the DCC Dorset population.
- At the other end of the age bands the under 20's have increased in number slightly but continue to make up just 22% of the population. But the most significant change is the reduction in those aged 25-34 which have fallen by a third over the 10 year period. This reduction has taken place at a time when the overall population has increased by 3.8%.

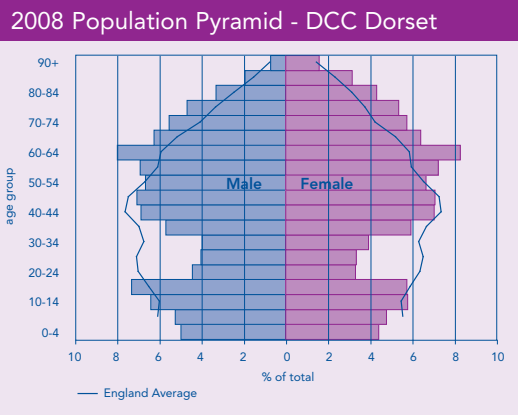

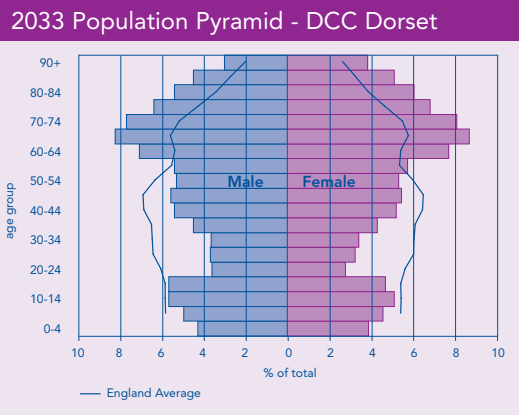

The Index of Deprivation includes seven main domains and six further sub domains. There is also a measure of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)\* made up from the other domains. Each of the 32,482 Super Output Areas (SOA's) in England have been assigned a score and rank. In Dorset there are 247 SOA's.

The domains are:

- Income Deprivation Domain
- Employment Deprivation Domain
- Health deprivation and Disability Domain
- Education, Skills and Training Domain with the sub domains: Children/Young people, and: skills
- Barriers to Housing and Services with the sub domains: wider barriers and Geographical barriers
- Crime Domain
- Living Environment Deprivation Domain with the sub domains: the "indoors" living environment and: the "outdoors" living environment

There are also supplementary income indicators:

- Income deprivation affecting children index
- Income deprivation affecting older people

\*The IMD 2010 is a measure of multiple deprivation at the small area level. The model of multiple deprivation which underpins the IMD 2010 is based on the idea of distinct dimensions of deprivation which can be recognised and measured separately. These are experienced by individuals living in an area. People may be counted in one or more of the domains, depending on the number of types of deprivation that they experience. The overall IMD is conceptualised as a weighted area level aggregation of these specific dimensions of deprivation.

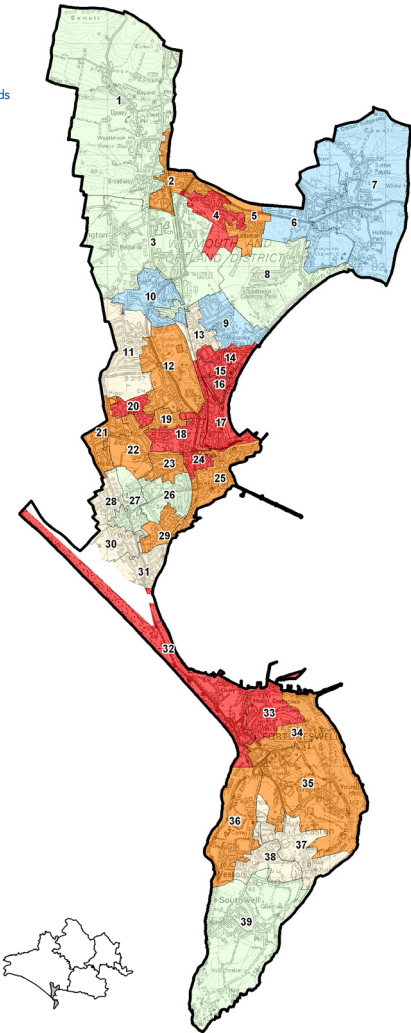
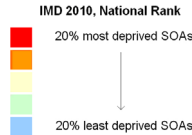

Purbeck Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010, National Rank



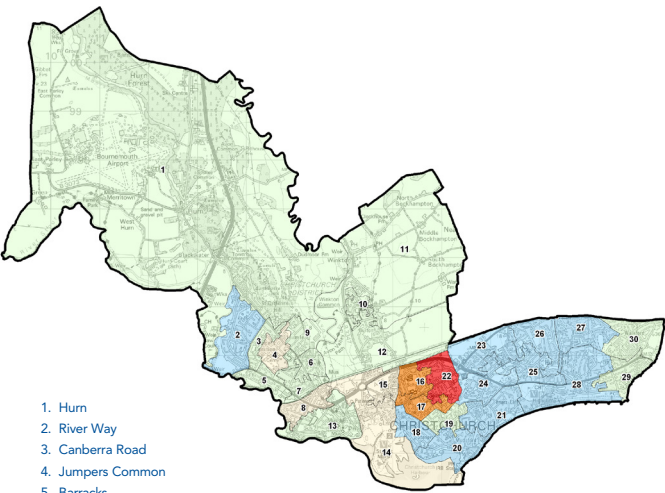

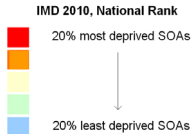

Christchurch Index of Multiple Deprivation 2010, National Rank



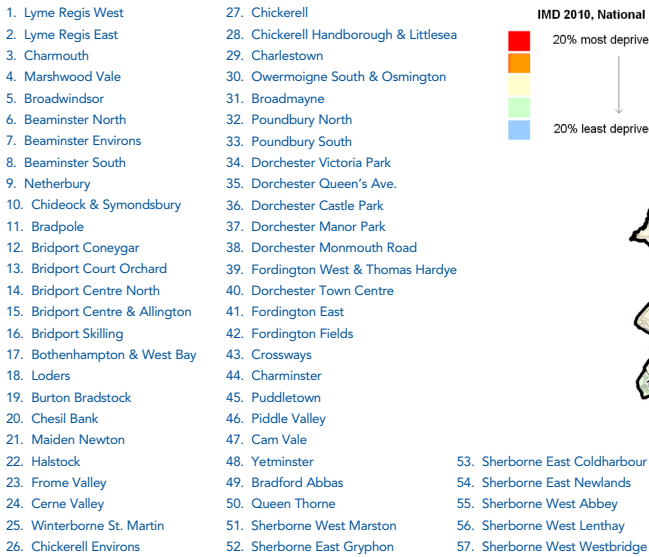

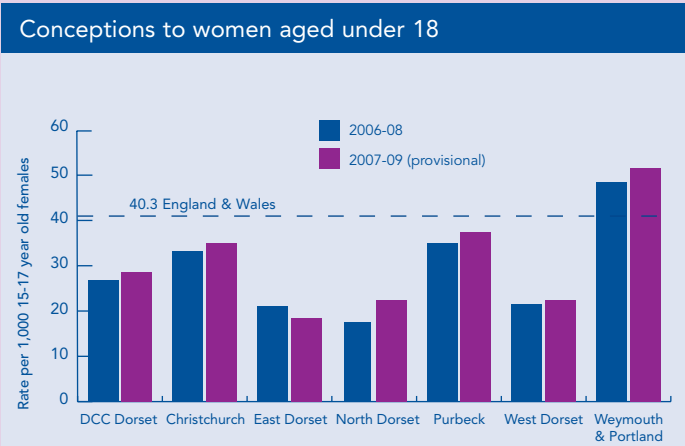

Teenage Conceptions

What the table shows

- Teenage conception rates are based on the total conceptions over a 3 year period. This is due to the fact that numbers are small and annual variations can appear quite large when expressed as a rate.
- Rates of teenage conceptions in DCC Dorset are generally low. The exception is Weymouth & Portland Borough where the rate is slightly higher than the national average.
- Between 2006-2008 and 2007-2009 there was a slight rise in the teenage conception rate across most of DCC Dorset, with the exception East Dorset district where the rate fell slightly.
- Nationally there has been a slight fall in the teenage conception rate.

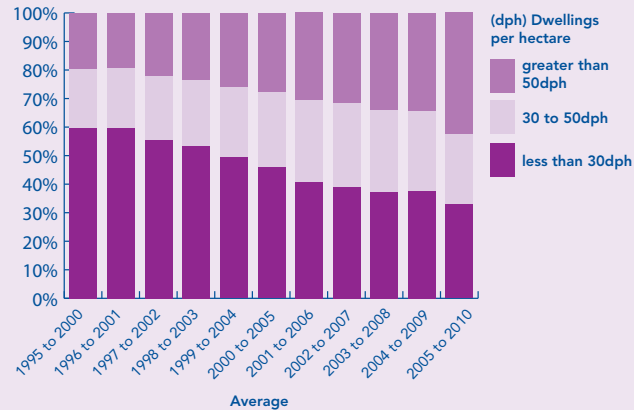

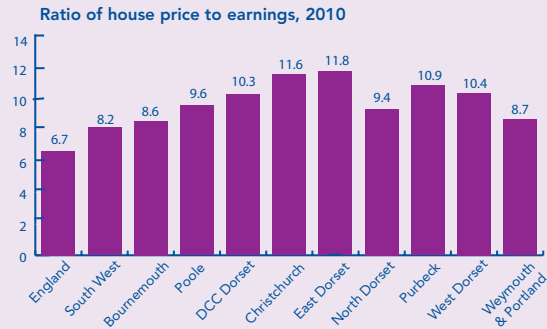

Dorset housing affordability 2010

In order to measure affordability, the ratio of house prices at the lower quartile (the value below which the lowest 25% of house prices fall) to individual earnings at the lower quartile (taken from the Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings 2010 – ASHE') is given. This method is more appropriate than many others for measuring affordability based on the assumption that it will be mostly young people, who are likely to have lower than average earnings and be looking for lower priced houses, entering the housing market. For 2010, the lower quartile house prices in England were over 6.5 times greater than the lower quartile individual earnings. The ratio in the South West was greater at 8.17 and DCC was greater still with lower quartile house prices more than ten times the lower quartile individual earnings.

In the BDP area, Bournemouth had the most affordable houses with the lowest ratio of lower quartile house prices to lower quartile earnings at 8.55 – still considerably above the national average. DCC Dorset had the highest ratio of 10.33 and Poole's ratio in 2010 was 9.55. Within DCC Dorset, the ratio of lower quartile house prices to lower quartile earnings ranged from 8.69 in Weymouth & Portland to 11.83 in East Dorset. Other than North Dorset and Weymouth & Portland, all the districts in DCC Dorset had ratios where lower quartile house prices were more than ten times the lower quartile earnings. The ratios of all the DCC Dorset districts, along with Bournemouth, Poole and the County level as a whole, are greater than the ratio for the South West and England.

Between 2009 and 2010 the ratio of house prices and earnings at the lower quartile in England increased by 0.41. The ratio in the South West increased by 0.54. Within the BDP area, the ratio for Poole increased the most, with a difference between 2010 and 2009 of 1.11. The ratios in DCC Dorset and Bournemouth also increased by 1.03 and 0.44 respectively. Within the County, Purbeck had the largest increase in the ratio between lower quartile house prices and earnings of 2.9 and West Dorset had the



smallest increase of 0.51. The increase in the ratios suggests that house prices are increasing at a faster rate than earnings and that houses became less affordable in 2010, compared to 2009. The fact that house prices increased in 2009-2010 is encouraging for the housing market. However, with earnings not growing at the same rate, (probably due to the current economic climate), and with local pay below the national level on average, further increase in house prices will only make it more difficult for local people to buy their own home in this area.

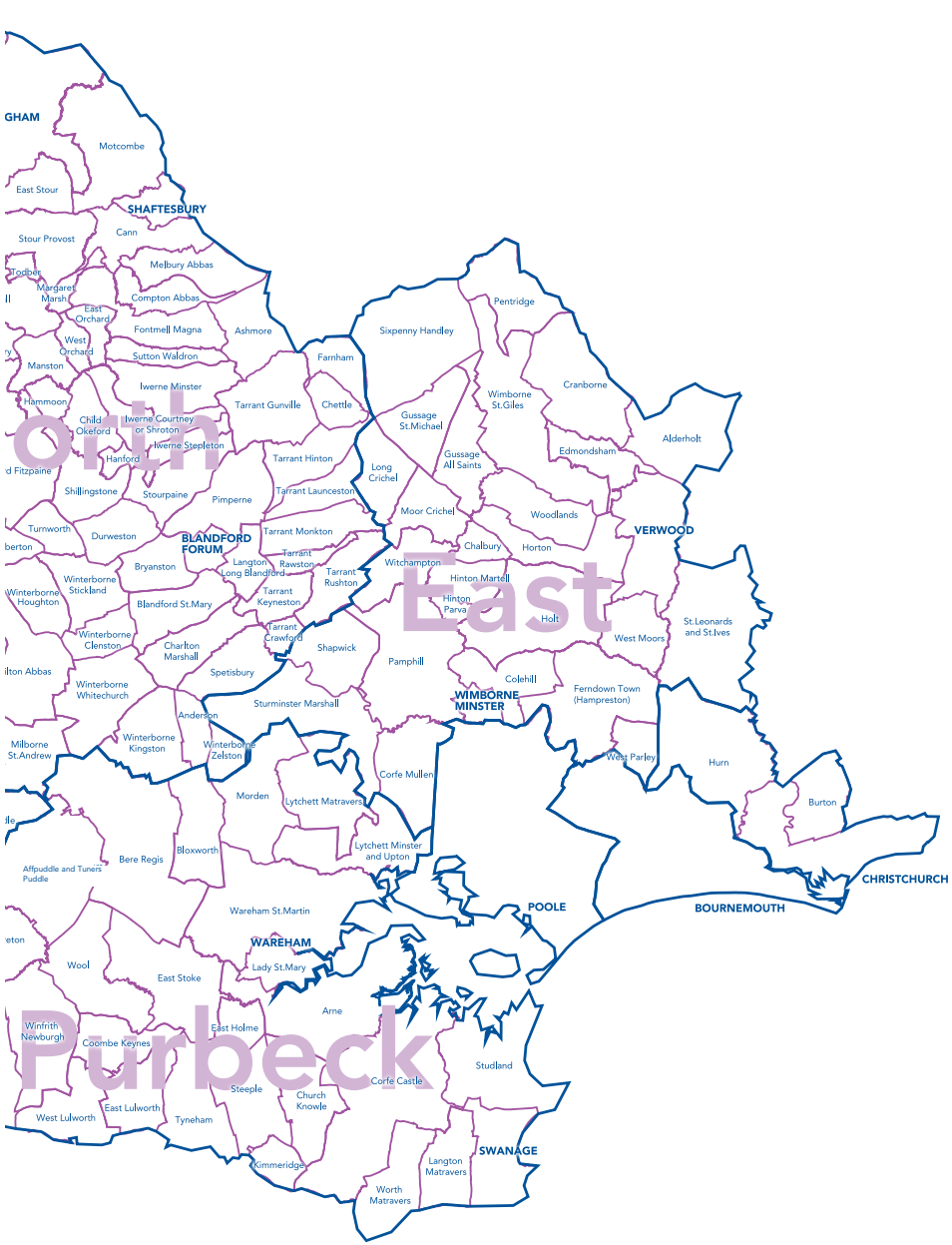

What the table shows

DCC Dorset has around 20,415 businesses, not including the self-employed.

93% of DCC Dorset's firms are 'small' with fewer than 20 employees, marginally above the national and regional averages.

Similarly, the percentage of micro firms, those with fewer than ten employees, is just above the national and regional level in DCC Dorset.

Within DCC Dorset, North Dorset and East Dorset in particular have above average proportions of small and micro firms.

DCC Dorset has only about 50 firms employing 250 or more people. These are largely in West Dorset, East Dorset and North Dorset.

- DCC Dorset has about 18,110 active businesses (registered for VAT or PAYE).
- There was a net gain loss of around 260 firms over the year.
- The business birth rate was 8.4% in 2009 - below the national average and much in line with the regional average.
- However, the five year business survival rate is above average in DCC Dorset at 53% compared with 47% nationally.

Earnings

What the table shows

- Earnings data relate to the gross pay of employees on adult rates before tax, National Insurance or other deductions.
- “Workplace based” means the earnings of people who work in an area but don’t necessarily live there. This is best used when looking at the economy as it shows what businesses actually pay.
- “Residence based” means the earnings of people who live in the area but don’t necessarily work there.
- The median measure is preferred to the mean as it is less affected by extreme values. The median is the mid-point value.
- In DCC Dorset, residence based earnings continue to be higher than workplace based earnings, probably as a result of people living here but commuting outside the county for higher paid work.
- Purbeck is the exception in the county with workplace earnings above residence based earnings.

Note: the ASHE is a sample survey and the findings are subject to sampling error.

Value Added – GVA

What the table shows

GVA per resident head is considerably below the national average in DCC Dorset. In DCC Dorset, GVA per resident head is also much lower than in Bournemouth & Poole. This poorer performance is likely to arise largely from two factors:the structure of the population with a higher proportion of people not actively contributing towards GVA commuting patterns: the income of commuters is allocated to the area in which they work and DCC Dorset has a net loss of commuters

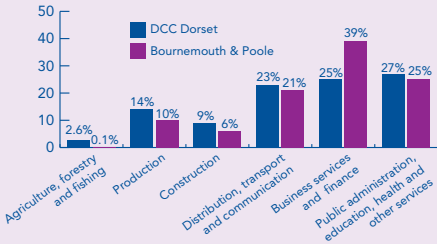

What the table shows

- In line with national and regional trends, unemployment in DCC Dorset is higher than it was ten years ago but has fallen in the last year, which reflects the current economic climate.
- Unemployment is highest in the urban areas, such as Weymouth & Portland and Bournemouth.
- At local level, claimant count numbers are not seasonally adjusted. Seasonal effects can be seen in the monthly figures with unemployment normally peaking after Christmas and often as summer ends.

Keyfacts

- Historically, pupils in DCC Dorset perform better than the national average. In 2009/10, 59% of pupils attained 5+ GCSEs or equivalent grades A\*-C including Maths and English. The equivalent figure for England is 55% (Department for Education)
- 26% of adults in DCC Dorset have no academic qualifications. (2001 Census)
- In 2010 estimates show, 5-15 year olds made up 12.2% of the DCC Dorset population, but projections suggest this will fall to 10.1% by 2033. (ONS)
- Dorset County Council (DCC) spends around 56% (£352million) of its budget (£626 million) on Children's Services (2011/12). Children's Services includes schools and other education plus Children's Social Care & Health. (DCC Council Tax Guide 2011/12)
- At January 2011, DCC Dorset had 168 mainstream schools teaching 53,254 pupils. There were 23,532 pupils in primary schools, 6,142 in middle schools and 23,580 in secondary schools.
- Pupil/Teacher ratios in DCC Dorset are 21.0 pupils per teacher in primary schools and 16.2 in middle/secondary (DCC - Jan 2011)

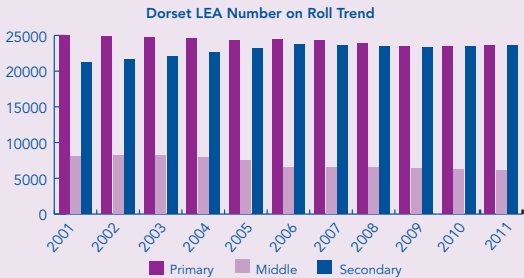

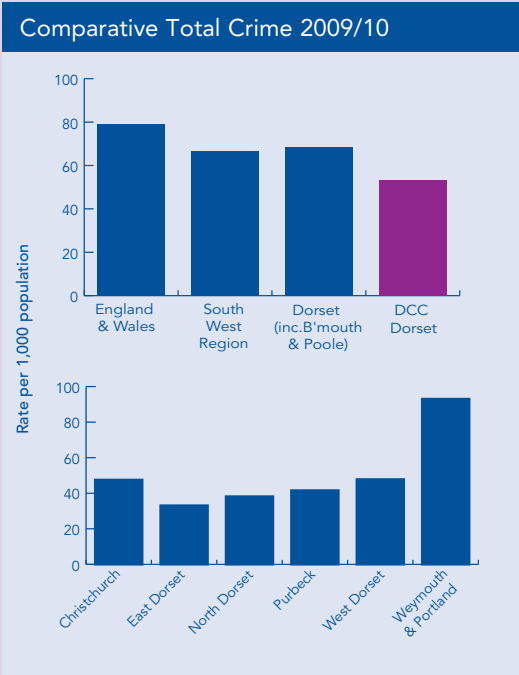

In 2009/10, the rate of total recorded crime (per 1,000 head of population) in DCC Dorset was over one-third lower than the figure for England and Wales and well below the rate for the South West Region overall.</li><li>However, across the local authority areas within DCC Dorset, significant variations in crime levels are apparent. 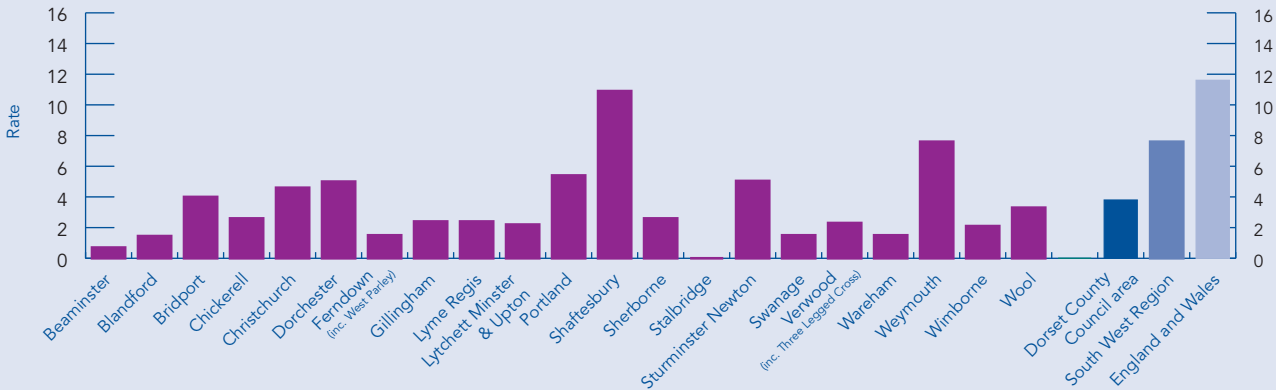

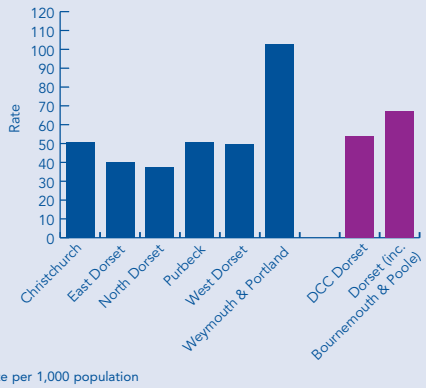

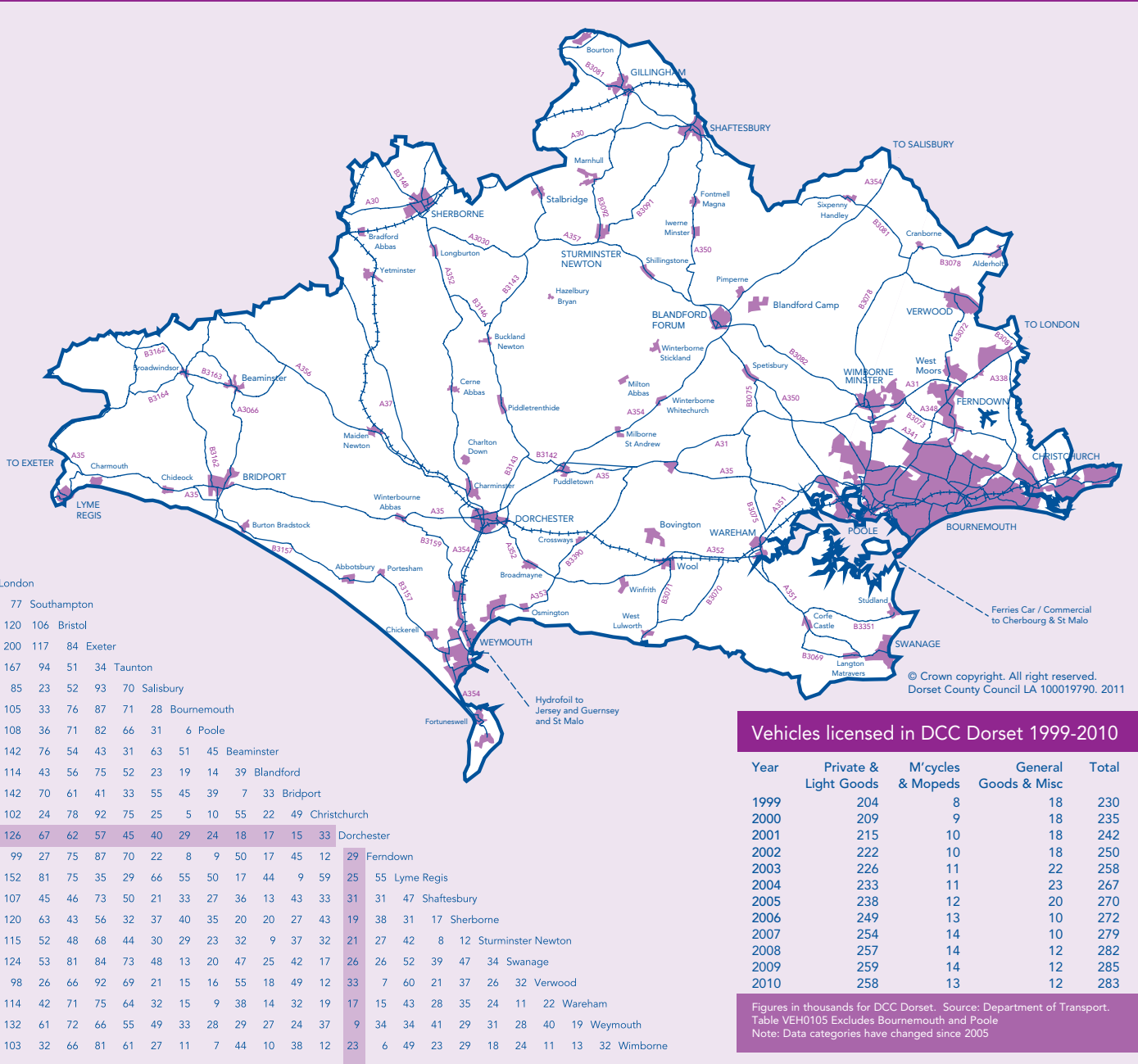

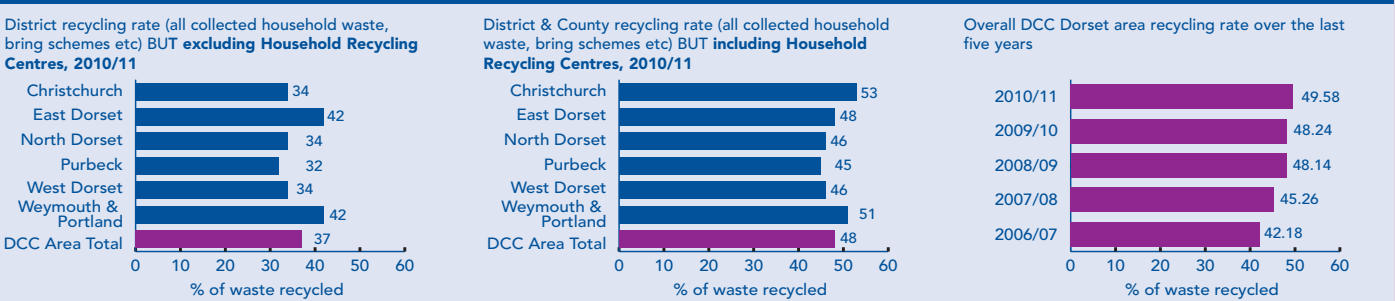

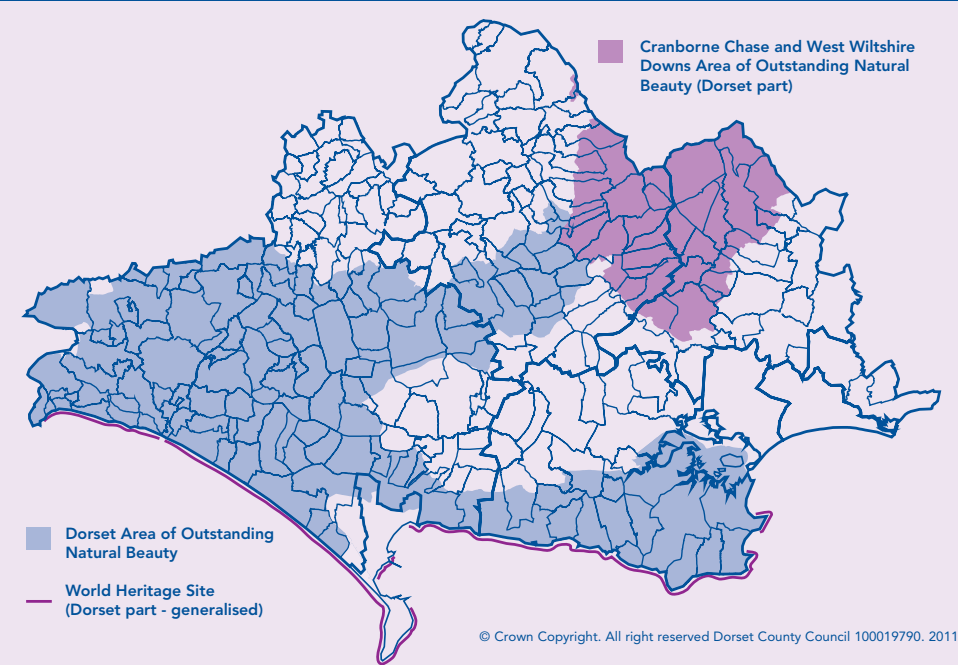

Dorset’s Natural Environment keyfacts

DCC Dorset is one of the most important counties in England for nature conservation interest. The rich and diverse habitats are attributed to a wide combination of factors which include varied geology, a relatively low level of development, a maritime influence and geograhical location. Species found include:

- 85% of all species of mammals living in Britain,
- 90% of all our birds,
- 80% of all our butterflies,
- 70% of our dragonflies and,
- nearly all our reptiles and amphibian species.

What is special about Dorset’s environment?

- The environment is particularly valued because of a combination of features in a relatively small area. For example:
- DCC Dorset has 11% of the UK’s rare lowland heath - virtually all of which is rated as of International importance for its wildlife.
  - All the DCC Dorset coast (excluding the town seafronts) is nationally recognised for it’s unique landscape, scenic quality, wildlife and geological formations.
  - DCC Dorset hosts thousands of rare species, including a thriving population of red squirrels on Brownsea island. DCC Dorset also supports 80% of the national population of rare smooth snakes and 90% of sand lizards.
  - DCC Dorset still has significant areas of chalk downland supporting a concentrated richness of plants and insects with, for example, the largest populations of the Adonis Blue butterfly in the country.
  - DCC Dorset has a very rich historic environment - whilst making up only 2% of the area of England it has 5% of the nationally protected ancient monuments.

European Conservation Sites

**Sites - European Habitats** Directives provide for the conservation of habitats and the protection of species through the designation of Special Protection Areas (SPAs), Special Areas of Conservation (SACs) and RAMSAR sites (internationally important wetlands). These areas form a network of internationally important wildlife sites within the European Union known as ‘Natura 2000’ sites. Within DCC Dorset there are 4 SPAs, 4 Ramsars and 14 SACs.

SSSIs - Sites of Special Scientific Interest

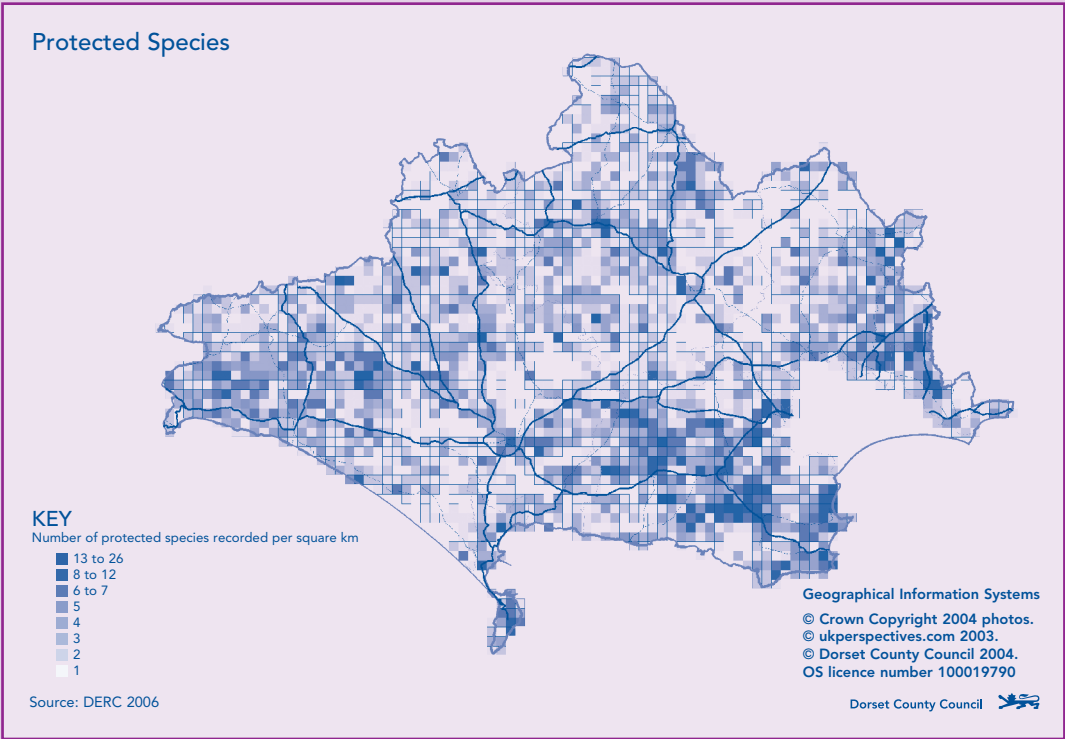
are sites of geological, geomorphological and ecological characteristics that are of national significance, designated by Natural England under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

There are over 4,000 SSSIs in England, covering around 7% of the country’s land area. Over half of these sites, by area, are internationally important for their wildlife, and designated as Special Areas of Conservation (SACs), Special Protection Areas (SPAs) or RAMSAR sites. Many SSSIs are also National Nature Reserves (NNRs) or Local Nature Reserves (LNRs). In Dorset, including Bournemouth and Poole, there are 141 SSSIs, which cover 8% of the county’s land area.

**LNRs - Local Nature Reserves** are managed for both people and wildlife. They are places with wildlife or geological features that are of special interest locally, which give local people special opportunities to study and learn about them or simply enjoy and have contact with nature. LNRs are statutory designations declared by Local Authorities under the provision of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949. There are now over 1,050 LNRs in England. In total they cover almost 40,000 ha - an impressive natural resource which makes an important contribution to England’s biodiversity. In Dorset there are 49 LNRs, including Bothenhampton, Thorncombe Wood, and Corfe Hills.

**Protected Species** - In the UK, certain plants and animals, and all wild birds, are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. Badgers are protected under their own legislation, the Protection of Badgers Act 1992. Some species e.g. bats, sand lizards, otters and great crested newts, have additional protection under European Law, to reflect their threatened conservation status, which in the UK is enforced by the Consevation (Natural Habitats, & c.) Regulations 1994.
